The Grade 5/6 Inquiry unit this term is based on economics and financial math, and focuses on 'What makes people spend their money?' As part of the unit, each student has formed a business with other students. Students are responsible for creating a business plan, and providing a service or creating products for the rest of the school to buy.

Students will be selling a variety of food items - (slices, lollies, pancakes, ice-creams, sausages, hamburgers)- drinks, slime, hand-made craft items such as toy snakes, stress balls, as well as activities to participate in eg. Nerf guns, obstacle course. Items will range in price from 50c to \$5. One stall only will have 10c and 20c items.
