Dear Families.

A very special welcome to the many families new to our school. We are delighted to have you join the GPS community. While we have many new Prep families, we also have a number of new students throughout the school. Welcome also to our existing families! Please ensure that when you see a new person, say hello and introduce yourself!

A couple of important reminders:

- DET doesn't allow students to access their mobile phones while at school. Students are required to bring their mobile phone to the administration area where it will be secured for the day.
- The school grounds are supervised from 8:45am daily. Students should not arrive at school prior to this time. Before School Care is available for families requiring earlier attendance.

We are looking forward to getting to know families at the Family/ Teacher interviews on Thursday the 15th of Feb. This meeting will focus on getting to know the student, their unique abilities, and their needs. Students are required to attend the interview. Students are to be picked up from school at 1:30pm on the day to allow the teachers to conduct the interviews. Please book through Sentral.

This year we are aiming high for our students, and one of the things families can do is to make sure your child is at school on time, and at school every day (unless they are unwell). The first hour of the school day is critically important academically and in terms of the child's ability to settle in and feel a sense of belonging in the classroom. Regular attendance improves academic achievement (as we can't teach students who aren't here). While the occasional necessary absence is unlikely to have a significant impact on learning, regular absence is going to make progressing at the child's capacity challenging.

If being on time, or daily attendance is an issue for your family, please contact the school so that we can assist.

Finally, thank you to all of the staff, students and families for such a smooth and calm start to the year. It has been wonderful to walk around the school and watch children learning and working hard so quickly.

MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause.

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

Exceptions: For a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may be granted.

Please contact me if you would like to discuss this.

Emergencies: In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

Health Update for our GPS community

Good afternoon GPS families

This is a timely reminder to be vigilant with cold/flu symptoms.

Whilst school attendance is critically important, this does not include unwell children.

To minimise the spread of sickness in our school please do not send your child to school if they have any cold/flu symptoms.

Department of Education & Training – Management of Covid-19 in schools

It is recommended that staff members, students or visitors who have symptoms of cold, influenza or COVID-19 undergo testing for COVID-19.

Parents of symptomatic students will be asked to collect their child from school and keep them home until they are no longer symptomatic.

Students should not attend school until their symptoms resolve.

Most people are still infectious after 5 days and you should stay home if you are still experiencing symptoms like a runny nose, sore throat, cough, shortness of breath, fever, chills, or sweats.

A negative RAT result is a helpful tool to determine whether you are still infectious. If you're unsure about ending your isolation, you should contact a GP or a GP Respiratory Clinic.

At school we will continue to use strong hygiene measures including sanitising, handwashing, air filters, open doors and supporting those students who wish to wear a mask.

FOR THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN AND ALL PEDESTRIANS AT THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL, PLEASE DO NOT LET YOUR CHILDREN OUT OF THE CAR ON THE ROAD SIDE. PLEASE MAKE SURE THEY GET OUT ON THE KERB. ALSO PARKING WITHIN THE FLAG AREA IS ILLEGAL AND FINES WILL BE GIVEN IF YOU ARE FOUND IN THESE AREAS.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

**If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$150 for primary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below. If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you are eligible, you only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed to Grovedale PS this year.
- changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year (eg: This includes an existing family who has a NEW student starting at Grovedale Primary School)

Check with the school office if you are unsure if you have completed a CSEF form or if we have applied on your behalf due to the fact that you received the funding in 2023.

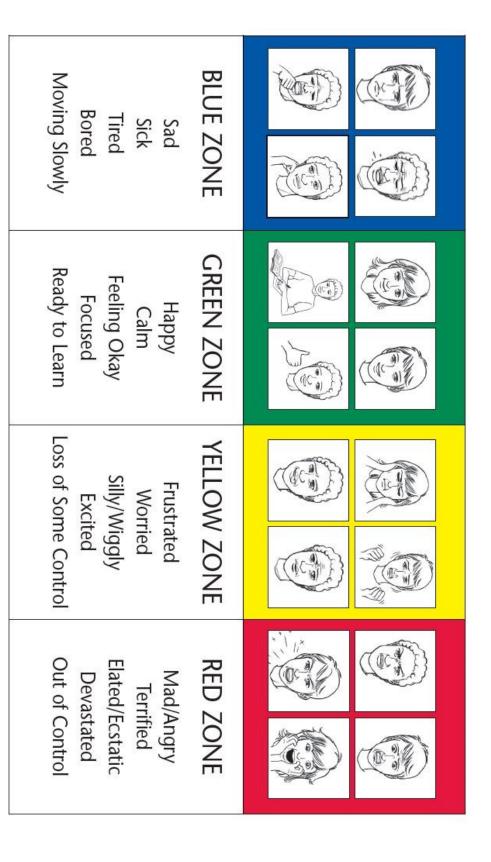

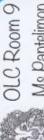
