School Council

Last week we had a School Council meeting where we discussed a range of topics including 2025 planning, early discussions about the location and design of the kinder, the Parent/Carers Opinion Survey data, the School Uniform Code, school finances, buildings and grounds reports and a general conversation about school communication.

Our school has an Enrolment Management Plan for 2025 which means that due to our growth in recent years, we cannot accept students outside our zone who are not siblings. There is an appeals process families can use if they are wishing to enrol and believe that there is grounds for an appeal based on the Department of Education Enrolment Policy. https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/enrolment/policy

Discussions around communications included developing a deeper understanding of what systems and processes are working well and where we could make some adjustments to continually improve our communications with families. This ties in well with our earlier sharing of the Parent/Carer's Survey data in which we recognised that parents would like more information on how to help your child at home, and how your child is going at school.

The School Uniform Code was discussed and Council was satisfied with the current policy, however we did discuss the transition period and ensuring that families have time to replace non-uniform items such as leggings, as the season changes.

Please also remember that we are available to talk to directly if you have questions or concerns. I am on duty out the front on most days, you can catch me there, you can come into the office and ask to see me, you can book an appointment through the office (Alison and Kathee have access to my calendar) and you can send an email to Grovedale.ps@education.vic.gov.au with the heading 'Attention Tina' and it will be forwarded to me.





MESSAGE FROM OUR SCHOOL COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Parents and Caregivers,

The purpose of this communication is to address the recent discussions regarding our school uniform policy, specifically the topic of leggings. I want to assure you that the School Council has carefully considered this matter and has made a conscious decision to uphold the existing policy, which does not - and did not - include leggings as part of the approved uniform.

While we acknowledge that some students may prefer leggings due to their comfort and versatility, there are many alternative options available, including tracksuit pants and other comfortable bottoms that adhere to the uniform policy. We have provided resources in our newsletter to assist you in finding suitable replacements and if you encounter financial difficulties in purchasing new uniform items, please do not hesitate to reach out to the school for assistance.

The enforcement of the policy is based on several factors, including:

- O **Durability:** Leggings are often worn frequently and tend to wear out quickly, becoming thin, discolored, or developing holes. This can create a less polished and untidy appearance for our students.
- O **Fit:** As children grow, leggings can become too small, leading to discomfort and a less than ideal fit.

Enforcement Challenges: Asking school staff to enforce a policy that requires subjective judgments about the appropriateness of leggings is not a reasonable expectation.

We understand that some parents have mentioned sensory issues as a reason why their child needs to wear leggings, and while we acknowledge individual preferences, it's important to distinguish between preference and medical conditions. If your child has a diagnosed condition that necessitates specific clothing accommodations, we strongly encourage you to speak to the school to discuss appropriate solutions.

We appreciate the feedback and concerns raised by our community, and we want to emphasise our commitment to working together to ensure a positive and productive learning environment for all students that promotes our school values and behaviours.

School Saving Bonus

Information for government school parents and carers

About the School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is making life that little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus. This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024.

Who receives the School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Parents and carers of children who meet the School Saving Bonus eligibility above are required to do the following by **Friday 18 October 2024**:

Complete enrolment : If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025, please complete enrolment. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.

Check your contact information : Ensure your contact information is up to date with your school. You can check this information by contacting your school directly.

Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

You do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus. The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system.

You can decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs. You can choose how to allocate the \$400 in the online system.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- camps, trips, excursions and incursions
- swimming and sporting programs
- outdoor education programs
- graduations
- school uniforms
- textbooks.

The bonus can be used at your school's approved textbook or uniform suppliers either in-store or online, or through State Schools' Relief. The list of suppliers may include a school uniform or bookshop. Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities.

Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

Families with more than one eligible child

Families who have more than one child at the same school can combine their School Saving Bonus payments to use on one child, or for a specific activity. So, for example, a family with 3 children who are all government school students would receive support to the value of \$1,200 and choose how they spend those funds. The School Saving Bonus cannot be combined across different schools.

MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

A reminder that the Department of Education has in place a mobile phone ban that requires students who bring mobiles phones to school to have them switched off and securely put away during school hours.

The department is requiring all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year.

The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state.

This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions.

By ensuring mobile phones are kept away at recess and lunch times, students can interact with each other face-to-face, without the distractions and social pressures that mobile phones can cause.

I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school.

Exceptions: For a small number of students with particular health needs, an exception to the policy may be granted. Please contact me if you would like to discuss this.

Emergencies: In the event of an emergency or if you need to immediately contact your child, I ask that families contact the school office who will pass on a message as required.

School mobile phone policy: A copy of our school's local mobile phone policy, which implements the government's mobile policy in line with our local context, is available here. (if you cannot get the link, it is on the school's website)

Parent support: The Mobile phones in schools webpage provides links to resources for families to help them balance their children's time using mobile phones.


