Is Flavoured Milk Healthy?

Many people continue to argue over whether flavoured milk is healthy for children.

Flavoured milk is higher in sugar and kilojoules than non-flavoured milk, but some parents complain that their children simply refuse to drink plain milk. So are they better off consuming the extra sugar and kilojoules in flavoured milk than not consuming any milk at all? Milk is packed with nutrients. One cup of low-fat milk contains over 400 kilojoules and 13 grams of sugar (in the form of lactose, a sugar found naturally in milk) and about 300 milligrams of calcium (about 25 percent of kids' daily need) as well as vitamins A, B, and D, and minerals like potassium and phosphorus. The same amount of low-fat

flavoured milk contains an extra 250 kilojoules and 12 grams of added sugar (so nearly twice the amount of sugar). Over time that extra sugar and kilojoules add up, explains Joy Bauer, nutrition and health expert for the Today show. "I don't recommend that kids drink flavoured milk," says Bauer. Instead, she says it's definitely best to encourage your kids to drink plain low-fat milk. If your child will only drink flavored milk, Bauer says it's better to serve them milk that you flavour slightly at home, where you can make your own healthier version. "At home parents can control the kind of milk poured and the amount of syrup or milo stirred in," she says. One thing most experts can agree on: Kids need to get enough calcium (800 milligrams a day for ages 4 to 8; 1,300 milligrams a day for ages 9 to 18; 800) and milk is an important calcium source in most kids' diets. To reach those amounts, children need multiple servings of calcium-rich foods a day, including milk, yogurt, cheese, and leafy green vegetables like spinach and broccoli. Bottom line: Pre-mixed flavoured milk contains added sugar and kilojoules that kids don't need, and it should be avoided. Natural low-fat milk and water are the preferred drinks for children. If your child will only drink flavoured milk, serve it at home where you can make your own healthier version.

EMA / BOOK PICKUP & PAYMENT OPTIONS 2015

As from 2015 the Government is **no longer providing payments for the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA).** Those families who have been able to claim the EMA to help with school related costs will no longer be receiving the EMA.

With this in mind School Council has kept the materials charge at **\$210** per student per year which is the same as 2014.

This covers such things as:

Shared use text books such as atlases & dictionaries, calculators, teaching & learning materials such as handbooks, work planners, cooking ingredients, class & home worksheets and diaries as well as reading materials including home & guided reading, Reading Eggs & Mathletics.

Then throughout the year extra costs may be incurred with excursions, incursions and other activities, the swimming program every alternate year and our camping programs.

Payment Plan

To help minimise the financial impact of school charges families may put a Payment Plan in place. This can be done at the beginning of the year, in term 4 of this year 2014 or at any time throughout the year when making payments may be more difficult. We can work out a fortnightly, monthly or term option – whatever is easiest for you. For example you may have 3 children at the school. The materials charge at the start of the year would be \$630. You might like to pay for example \$100 then make fortnightly payments of \$40 until it is paid off. Please just come and see us in the office if at any time you would like to organise a payment plan.

PAYMENT & BOOK PACK COLLECTION

The school will be open for book collection and payment on:

Tuesday January 27 2015 between 9am and 12 noon.

The first day of school for all students is Thursday January 29.

Payment may be made by cash, cheque or EFTPOS.

If you are unable to make full payment on the day of pick up, please remember that we can organise a payment plan for you. Just come to the office and we will implement a suitable plan.

Payments or payment plans for 2015 may be made prior to the end of the 2014 school year at any time.

Return of Excursion notes and payments.

Please be mindful of returning excursion notes and payment on time. Excursions take a great deal of organising and planning and late return of notes simply may mean that students miss out on attending.
